Acharei Mot Kedoshim Emor - The titles of the Torah portions we are currently reading, when put together in this fashion, mean "After death one should tell things that are unique and sacred" about a person who has died. These are the only words I remember from the Rabbi's eulogy for my Zaydie, whose Yahrzeit was on Mother's Day this year. I am surprised I remembered that much, as this was over 40 years ago - but some things do stick in the memory.

These past few weeks have been a time for remembering the masses who have died, and for mourning those who have newly been killed. May what we and the world says about them remain in the realm of the sacred.
